

Traffic (Amendment) Bill 2014: A 30kph speed limit near schools will save lives

HOW MANY MORE CHILDREN SHOULD DIE BEFORE WE ACT ?

The number of children who have died in the last five years from car crashes is the equivalent to the loss of two entire primary schools. The Traffic (Amendment) Bill 2014 will protect our children by introducing speed restrictions and safety features on roads near schools and ensure school transport vehicles meet prescribed safety standards.

July 1, 2015: Grief as Three-Year-Old is Killed by School Bus in Nyayo Estate

Three-year-old Bradley was killed in an accident that took place when a school bus run him over- right outside the building where his home was. The school bus from Good Testimony Kindergarten had just dropped Bradley and his five-year-old brother- Jason Onyango from school when the tragedy occurred. While what exactly happened is not clear, contradictory statements continue surrounding the accident.

Aug 7, 2015: Child Killed, 15 Injured in Nairobi Road Accidents

A child died after being hit by an Umoinner matatu in Nairobi's Shauri Moyo estate on Friday morning while heading to school. The child, his mother and a sibling were hit at a zebra crossing on Ambila Road, by the matatu which witnesses said was speeding. The matatu is being held at Makongeni police station. The two were taken to Metropolitan Hospital and the body to City Mortuary
